

'Sex-harass' super sued

Five women who claim to have been sexually harassed by their Upper West Side building super — who is a convicted child rapist — are suing the fiend and their landlord.

The women allege repeated vile requests from super William Barnason for sex in exchange for rent reductions. They also cite an incident in which Barnason, who lost his job after The Post exposed his shocking past, allegedly drugged one of the women and tried to drag her to an unoccupied apartment before being stopped by another tenant.

The women also accuse landlord Stan Katz and his son Steven of stealing their mail and checks to increase financial pressure on them, making it easier for Barnason to extort sexual favors.

The feds are probing that claim, according to the Manhattan federal court action, which joins a related Justice Department lawsuit against Stan Katz and Barnason.

The women's lawyer, Joshua Friedman, said, "I've never seen a case like this in my life. It's . . . the most outrageous case of sexual harassment by a landlord."

Katz's lawyer, Dewey Golkin, said, "The allegations are false."
